Academic Programs



Kyoto University International Undergraduate Program (Kyoto iUP) Kyoto iUP is a bilingual program which will take 4.5 years comprising with 6 months preparatory course followed by 4 years of undergraduate study. No requirement for Japanese skill at the outset. At the 1st-2nd years, students will study in English and at the 3rd-4th years will study in Japanese.



English-taught degree programs Kyoto University offers a wide range of degree programs for international students which are conducted entirely in English. Students with no Japanese language ability can study for degrees while taking advantage of the University's world-class research facilities and education.
